Well Owner Assistance Program

- Provide and install meters at no charge (funding for 8 meters
- Provide water conservation evaluations for indoor and outdoor use
- Provide indoor water savings devices
- (long term) Provide cost-share incentives for water savings landscape projects
- Landowners self report usage (confidentially)
- Potential for measuring ground water levels in partnership with the County

Program Benefits

- Knowledge of water use to provide a baseline for voluntary conservation efforts
- Decreased water use by well owners
- Potential savings through decreased pump cost and longer well life with reduced water use
- Data collection to assist in better understanding of groundwater in the basin
