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Groundwater Monitoring Well Construction (Olive Springs)




January 2024 – The Santa Cruz Mid-County Groundwater Agency (MGA) is installing a new shallow groundwater monitoring well on Olive Springs Road to enhance understanding of the interconnection between groundwater and surface water. The MGA and its member agencies (Soquel Creek Water District, City of Santa Cruz, County of Santa Cruz, and Central Water District) maintain a network of groundwater monitoring wells and surface water monitoring locations throughout the Santa Cruz Mid-County Groundwater Basin that serves to help sustainably manage groundwater resources.

Drilling the new monitoring well began Tuesday, January 9, 2024. The drilling and well construction is expected to take approximately four days. All work is anticipated to occur on weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place during construction. Residents near the new wells have been notified individually about the construction work.



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
